ⁱⁱ Note about definition of “diocese” and accuracy of data. Because of the nature of the data source, dioceses which contain only part of a county have assigned to them the data for the entire county. This will slightly inflate the data for some dioceses and the total for “all dioceses.” It should also be noted that the data for Eastern Rite Catholics (for the 15 Exarchates / Dioceses / Eparchies) in the various counties have been included in the data for the Latin Rite dioceses in which the relevant county is located. This will inflate the number of “Catholics” in those dioceses. The Catholic raw data files available to the Glenmary Research Center will allow reassigning data more appropriately as soon as time and resources permit.

ⁱⁱⁱ The term “Unclaimed” refers to the number of individuals within the diocesan boundaries who were not claimed as members by the religious groups which participated in the RCMS 2000 project. The number does NOT indicate the number who are “un-churched” because a number of religious groups did not participate in the study (E.g. most of the historically African-American churches, Jehovah’s Witnesses, and others). “Unclaimed” also does not mean that individuals, so counted, may not be, as individuals, “religious” or “spiritual.”
